


Oaktree Avenue, Palmers Green

The Blue Plaque Brigade by Dan Brotzel

The boroughs of Enfield and Barnet are richly scattered with homes that bear a Blue Plaque – the prestigious marker of a historic VIP who once lived there. Dan Brotzel takes us on a whistle-stop tour of some very local heroes, icons and pioneers...

Charles Joseph Coward, Chichester Road, Edmonton 1905-1976

The entirely misnamed Coward was a British soldier who helped Jewish prisoners escape from Auschwitz and played a key role as a witness in the post-war Nuremberg trials.

As a prisoner of war from 1940, he made several escape attempts from various camps before ending up at a labour camp in the Auschwitz complex in 1943. Because of his German-speaking skills he was made a Red Cross Trustee responsible for British POWs, and made use of this position to smuggle Jewish prisoners out of Auschwitz by swapping their identities with those of non-Jewish inmates who had died in the camp. He was later known for his exploits as 'The Count of Auschwitz'.

As well as his testimony at Nuremberg, his evidence at a trial in Germany in 1953 enabled thousands of survivors from Auschwitz to file lawsuits for compensation against their former oppressors.

Stevie Smith, Avondale Road, Palmers Green 1902 -1971

Smith's 'Not Waving But Drowning' was voted Britain's fourth most popular poem in 1995. Her distinctive voice, quirky and ironic, mixes the tragic and comic, and often hints at an underlying quiet desperation.

Smith spent most of her life in Palmers Green. She was fond of Grovelands Park and for many years was a keen Anglican churchgoer. Later she would lose her faith but continue to refer to herself as 'a lapsed atheist'.

Her poems and three novels can be playful and lightly satirical. She wrote affectionately about cats and was quietly sarcastic about men and marriage. But darkness always threatened. In 1953, she was invalided out of work on a full pension after attacking her employer with a pair of scissors then attempting suicide. Happily she recovered and resumed writing, and in 1970 was awarded the Queen's Medal for poetry.



Benjamin Waugh - the founder of the NSPCC, The Green, Southgate 1839-1908

Benjamin Waugh, born in Settle, Yorkshire, faced fragile health but pursued a church career after marrying Sarah Boothroyd. His work in Greenwich exposed him to children's sufferings, leading to advocacy for juvenile courts and children's prisons, detailed in his book "The Gaol Cradle, Who Rocks It?" He founded societies aiding impoverished families and, in 1884, established the NSPCC, later chaired by Earl Shaftesbury.

Waugh's tireless efforts resulted in legislation protecting children, including the Children's Charter and the Criminal Law Amendment Act. His advocacy shaped a society that, by 1889, had 32 branches and had impacted thousands of children, a legacy continuing to touch millions today. Waugh's dedication echoes through his blue plaque and the enduring impact of the NSPCC.



Sir Thomas Lipton, Southgate, 1850-1931

Sir Thomas Lipton led a remarkable life

as a successful entrepreneur and philanthropist. Born in 1848 in Glasgow, he ventured into the grocery business, eventually founding the renowned Lipton tea brand. His innovative marketing strategies and dedication to providing quality products made him a household name.

Lipton's ties to Southgate are linked to his residence at Osborne House, an estate in the area. He was a celebrated benefactor, supporting various local causes and charities.



Sir Hugh Myddelton, on the corner of Cunard Crescent and Bush Hill Road. N21

Sir Hugh Myddelton, a civil engineer, revolutionized London's hygiene by supplying clean water through the New River scheme.

Born in Denbigh, he moved to London as a Goldsmith apprentice in 1576 and engaged in international trade and the Society of Merchant Adventurers, contributing to the city's prosperity.

In 1609, Myddelton spearheaded the construction of the 38-mile-long New River from Hertfordshire, combating London's contaminated water crisis. Overcoming opposition and costing £18,500, it relied on gravity, with skilled laborers digging the channel and carpenters installing elm pipes. Despite initial pushback, King James I's support ensured completion by 1613.

Recognised through statues and a church burial, Myddelton's legacy endures, as the New River still supplies a significant portion of London's daily water consumption, highlighting his pioneering contribution to the city's health and growth.









The Blue Plaque Brigade



Charles (1775-1834) and Mary Lamb (1764-1847), Church Street, Edmonton

Brother and sister Charles and Mary Lamb were writers best known for their children's books.

The siblings came to live together as young adults in 1796 after Mary – who experienced serious mental health problems throughout her life – killed their mother with a table knife at their Holborn lodgings. Biographers have since categorised Mary's illness as bipolar disorder, and it appears her condition was exacerbated by the extreme strain she was under while caring for both her parents and working to support them.

Mary was released after trial and entrusted to her brother. In happy times, the pair were popular among London's literary circle, counting Samuel Taylor Coleridge, William Hazlitt, John Keats and Leigh Hunt among their friends.

As writers, Mary and Charles's collaborations included the books Tales from Shakespear [sic] (1807), Poetry for Children, Entirely Original (1809), and Mrs Leicester's School (1809).



The world's first cash machine, Barclays Bank, Enfield Town 1967

A blue plaque adorns Enfield town's Barclays Bank, marking the site of the world's inaugural cash machine unveiling on June 27, 1967. A half a century later there are estimated to be 3 million cash machines across the globe, with about 70,000 in the UK. More recently, Brits have been turning away from using cash. Last year, electronic debit card payments outnumbered physical money. Unsurprisingly, the number of ATMs in Britain has been shrinking alongside the drop in physical cash transactions.

Unite for Steve: A Sponsored Walk to Support Life, Hope, and Raise Awareness of Brain Cancer Research

Dearest Palmers Green Community,

In August 2022, our awesome friend Steve, aged 46, was diagnosed with a stage 4 Glioblastoma brain tumour.

After enduring 27 rounds of radiotherapy, multiple cycles of chemo, so many complications and hospital stays, a pulmonary embolism and losing the use of his left leg from a 4-hour seizure, poor Steve got the news that the treatment wasn't working and the tumour was growing.

As much as the NHS, UCLH and Queens Square Hospital have been amazing, Steve's family hit a dead end. They needed to do more. They couldn't access all the treatments they needed in the UK or on the NHS.



Fran. Steve's incredible wife tirelessly researched alternative treatment options and they have been travelling every 6 weeks to the IOZK clinic in Germany for immunotherapy treatment. The treatment includes Keytruda, hypothermia, onocolytic virus therapy and ultimately a customised vaccine. The treatment IS making a difference, his seizures have reduced, and his mobility has improved. Steve's latest scan finally showed stability, some tumour reduction and his medical team believe it's all going in the right direction. It's the first positive news that Steve and Fran have received since this hideous nightmare began. The challenge is that this treatment is extremely expensive.



Steve requires a variety of treatments. The aim being to prolong Steve's life and, potentially, stop the tumour in its tracks. We want to give Steve as much additional time with his family and daughter Autumn as possible.

Fran has been caring for Steve and raising funds for his treatment. She never thought this would happen to Steve or that they'd need to go outside the UK for care and that the care would cost hundreds of thousands of pounds. What this family has had to experience over the past year and a half has been incredibly sad to see and therefore we want to support them in any way we can.

We've come together and devised a plan for a sponsored walk on Saturday 24 February 2024, this will help keep Steve's treatment going and also raise awareness for much-needed brain cancer research. It was devastating to find out that brain tumours kill more people under 40 than any other cancer. Yet just 1% of the national spending on cancer research has been allocated to this devastating disease since 2002.

We are asking the Palmers Green community to please unite and sponsor us however big or small, every donation helps.

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




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

Follow the Palmers Green Art Trail Starting at Broomfield Park by David Williamson

The Palmers Green Art Trail runs from Broomfield Park into the high street. The Palmers Green Action Team, The Palmers Greenery Community Café, Friends of Broomfield Park, Enfield Council and local businesses have shown amazing vision to realise this growing landscape of artworks.



The Art Trail starts at The Palmers Greenery Community Café in Broomfield Park, the mural 'Canada Geese' by Laura McKendry was inspired by the wildlife in the park and brings a flash of colour to the café.

Nearby on the old bowling green clubhouse walls is a series of artworks created by community groups led by Prerana Phadnis.



In 2023 three new murals have been hand-painted on the former football changing rooms near the children's playground as part of a 'Curate Enfield' project. The artists of The Matchbox Collective held workshops with local children and community groups to form their ideas.





The fourth mural by them can be found at Green's Kitchen, 345 Green Lanes. All the murals were inspired by stories of Broomfield Park – its old aviary, lakes, orchard, wildlife, bees and flowers.

Other highlights of the Art Trail include:

The 'New River Life' Mural at the side of Palmers Green Station by ATM Street Artist celebrates the New River and freshwater life.



'Finding the Green in Palmers Green' is a series of station mosaics on the platform designed by Alex McHallam with Tamara Froud in collaboration with students at Laurel Park School.



At the triangle you will find 'The Pleasure of Friendship' sculpture by Ruth Hallgarten, a memorial to renowned local poet Stevie Smith. Lit up at night 'Luna Woman Power Totem' by Lauren Baker celebrates the suffragettes' historical gathering on the triangle in 1914, which led to women gaining the right to vote.

A mural outside Arbeit Studio by Eloisa Henderson-Figueroa celebrates the opening of Arbeit Studios in Palmers Green.

Another art work inspired by Stevie Smith 'Can it be?' is a poem painted by Trin Brierly on road and walls as part of the development of Devonshire Square.

At the corner of Hazelwood Lane and Green Lanes is a blossoming rainbow of colour by designers Ginger & Green that brings interest and delight to this overlooked wall at Kiva Coffee House.

City - Città: Whether you're in a bustling "city" in England or a vibrant "città" in Italy, the shared term makes it easy to talk about urban adventures.

Restaurant - Ristorante: Dining out is a significant part of travel. The word "restaurant" is "ristorante" in Italian, offering a familiar term for culinary explorations.

If you're just starting to learn Italian, these similar words, called cognates, act like friendly helpers, making things easier for you.



Looking back to before Christmas, I had the pleasure of celebrating some of our local businesses here in Palmers Green to mark Small Business Saturday.

Increased business rates, for example, are causing real anxiety for small businesses. I believe this is wrong. It is simply not fair that high street businesses face large tax hikes while big, online corporations are let off the hook. As our economy has changed, the

tax system has failed to keep up and I am urging the Government to look at scrapping the current business rates system for a fairer system to support small businesses.

Another way to support our small businesses is to properly tackle crime and anti-social behaviour in our communities. This is something that comes up regularly in my casework. Over the past 13 years, more than 90% crimes are going unsolved. Shoplifting, for example, has reached record levels, with 1,000 offences per day around the UK.

For small businesses to thrive, we have to ensure that our high streets are safe. To do this, I think we need to look at increasing neighbourhood policing and reducing anti-social behaviour by tackling repeat offenders and supporting those who may need help.

A new year always brings new opportunities and optimism. It is an opportunity for our small businesses to thrive again, and I look forward to continuing to do everything I can to support them in the weeks and months ahead.













Standing Strong: The Unwavering Resolve of WASPI Women by Lauren Fulbright

In recent years, a growing movement has gained traction across the United Kingdom, bringing to light the hardships faced by a group of women who have been disproportionately impacted by changes to the state pension age. These women, part of the Women Against State Pension Inequality (WASPI) movement, have been campaigning for justice and fairness in pension entitlements.

The movement primarily comprises of around 3.6 million women born in the 1950s, who were directly affected by the changes introduced by the Pensions Act of 1995 and accelerated by the Pensions Act of 2011.

The changes increased the state pensions age for women from 60 to 66, resulting in a substantial delay in this demographic receiving their pensions entitlements. For many, this has caused incredible financial and emotional hardship and deep uncertainty in their retirement plans – in the worst cases, women have lost up to £50k of their state pension.

Advocating for a more equitable transition to the new pension age, WASPI has become a vital voice and, indeed, beacon of hope for these women. Their argument is grounded in the claim that this demographic has borne the brunt of an unjust policy and therefore has been unfairly targeted. Supporters of the movement stress that the lack of communication and adequate notice of the pension age changes has left a whole generation of women with an insufficient amount of time to plan for this financial shortfall. Calls for compensation to help bridge this financial gap have been, up until this point, stymied by court rulings that maintain any recommendations that the DWP reimburse 'lost' pensions would necessitate reversing primary legislation.

After five years of campaigning, however, there does appear to be a glimmer of light at the end of the tunnel with key findings from the PHSO finally set to be published in the coming weeks. The ombudsman has confirmed that any recommendations

made to the DWP are to be applied to all those effected by the 6-year set back in pension claims, potentially leading to millions of women in the UK receiving some financial compensation, as well as long overdue recognition of the failure of government to properly recognise the effect the policy has had on women born in the 1950s.

It must be remembered that through all of this, WASPI women are not seeking preferential treatment; they merely demand fairness and the acknowledgment of promises made by the government. Their campaign goes beyond rectifying past wrongs, rather it emphasises the need for future pension policy changes to be transparent, fair, and considerate of those affected. As the government contemplates elevating the pension age to 68, the WASPI cause warrants our collective attention and support, serving as a poignant reminder to ensure that policy changes are executed with due consideration for the individuals they directly impact.
